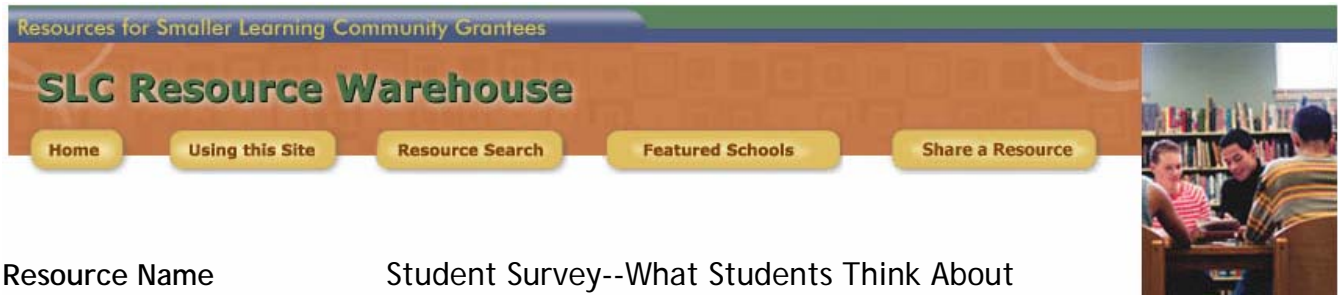

Resource Name Student Survey--What Students Think About Their Courses

Description This tool is a student survey that asks students about their classroom experience. Questions focus on the degree to which students are engaged in rigorous and relevant curriculum and instruction. The survey is designed to be administered by small school (there are four at this school: Information Systems, Living Systems, Physical Systems and Social Systems) and by subject area (four surveys are included each marked for a different core subject area). Information about the survey scales in authentic instruction (rigor, relevance, relationships, and substantive conversation) is attached as the last page of the document.

Instructions & Considerations

This tool may help you to:

- Survey students to gauge the level of rigorous and relevant curriculum and instruction
- Think about what feedback you want from students, as well as what elements you want to see in regular classroom practice

When applying this information to your setting you may want to consider the following:

- How the results of this data will be used to inform practice
- How to maintain student involvement and demonstrate how their feedback is being utilized to impact their learning experiences
- How this survey fits into a data collection plan to support continuous improvement process
- The survey questions reflect expectations that are held for classroom experience
